

Trees increase farm productivity and create more sustainable operations. Trees support whole farm systems to operate more efficiently. They can also boost your farm's profits and protect the health and sustainability of your landscape.

Whether you're looking for shelter, healthy soils, or biodiversity, trees can help. Design your plantings around your farm's needs and operations to maximise results. The boost to productivity from trees can even exceed the value of timber from harvesting.

Plant trees strategically to improve your farm's operations as they grow. Shelter Trees protect farms from heat, rain and wind. This brings a range of benefits, including isducing sitess on animals and crops. By

- planting trees for shelter, you can boost your farm's productivity in many ways:
- Animals shelter reduces livestock mortality and improves growth rates
- Crops shelter reduces damage to crops, improves soil fertility and extends growing seasons
- Water shelter reduces evaporation and improves irrigator efficiency in paddocks
- Farm shelter protects buildings and work areas and helps to control fire.

Soil health Healthy soil is the key to your farm's productivity. But some farming activities can degrade soil over time. Use trees to improve soil health in the following ways:

- Erosion Trees control wind speed, intercept rainfall, bind soils and control groundwater levels. This prevents soil erosion, landslip and the loss of fertile top soils.
- Fertility Trees drop leaves, twigs and branches, which gives nutrients to the soil. Trees also provide habitat for animals that turn soils for nutrient cycling.
- Salinity Trees intercept rainfall and uptake water from the ground. This controls groundwater flow and reduces the risk of salinisation (where excess salts gather in the soli surface).

Water quality

Many farms have rivers, streams, creeks and waterways. To keep landscapes, communities and livestock healthy, make sure that water coming onto your farm leaves in a similar condition.

Planting or restoring trees around waterways helps keep water clean and healthy. Trees manage sediment runoff from pasture soils and reduce nutrient overloads in waterways. Tree
roots also improve bank stability, which reduces erosion and flood risk.





Right Around Australia The story of Nevill Westwood and his Citroën Bubsie



In 2025, The Incredible Journey will be re-enacting another incredible journey undertaken 100 years earlier by young Nevill Westwood, who accidentally achieved the record of being the first person to drive right around Australia.

1925 · Here is part

On Tuesday, 17 August, Nevill and Greg left Pardoo Station and continued their way along the Madman's Track – a hot, dry, barren trail that had claimed a number of lives during the days of the gold rush in the late 1800s.

The track was now considered to be quite safe, but it was still a rough passage. During the wet season the cattle had churned the mud on the track into ridges, which then hardened in the hot sun. This made driving the track a bumpy, juddering experience and slowed the little car down considerably.

With all the jolting and shaking it was no wonder the men suddenly noticed petrol dripping from the petrol tank. They were all alone, with no help in sight and many miles yet to go, so they had to figure out a solution on their own.

They found the source of the leak, and groaned at how inaccessible it was. But they were resourceful, and found a piece of rubber tubing, which they ran from their spare petrol supply at the back of the little car to the carburettor at the front. This worked well for a while, and they congratulated themselves on their resourcefulness. But not for long... They soon discovered that the petrol was causing the rubber tube to perish, and their precious petrol was dripping out again. There was only one thing for it. Nevill reached down and plugged the hole in the petrol tank with his finger while he continued driving. However the leak was in such a remote spot he had to bend down awkwardly to cover it, which meant he now couldn't see the road!

So Greg navigated while Nevill drove, and in this way they managed to keep going. For a while at least, until they ran out of petrol! Now there was nothing they could do except start walking, which they did.


It was a scorching hot day and the only water they could find to drink was brackish, but they kept going and walked 20 miles along the Ninety-Mile Beach until they reached Anna Plains station that night. The owners were very hospitable and fed the exhausted men and gave them a bed for the night.

In the morning the manager drove them back to their car, gave them some more petrol and led them back to the station where they were able to have their fuel tank repaired. It was Friday by now, and as the men

avoided travelling on Sabbath they stayed another day at the station before continuing their journey. On Sunday Nevill and Greg thanked their hosts and set out for Broome, where they treated themselves to a stay at the Governor Broome Hotel. They luxuriated in having warm baths, comfortable beds and three good meals a day. In fact Nevill wrote to his mother: "Have been living on the fat of the land while in Broome, guess I have put on a few pounds. Three meals a day at the hotel. Good food, well cooked and as much as one desires." They enjoyed visiting with church members and Nevill even managed to arrange a date with 'Joan' and one of her girlfriends, taking them out to Cable Beach to enjoy the rest and relaxation together. It would have been a tight squeeze with three, maybe four people on the 1.2m wide seat!4

But it wasn't all holiday. The men never forgot they were on a mission and, tired as they were, they went around the town selling books and collecting money for missions.





PRAYER - What is it?

Think of some stories of where prayer was used. Hannah who was barren prayed for a son, and received Samuel who would go on to be a prophet,

priest & judge of Israel. Job had his health & possessions returned after praying for his friends. King Hezekiah prayed over his health report that gave him 3 days to live, & received another 15 years of life. Praying was the reason Daniel was thrown into the lions den, but they did him no harm. Jonah prayed for deliverance from the belly of the great fish, who'd swallowed him whole. Jesus prayed often, for many people, & taught His disciples how to pray. Peter used prayer to raise Tabitha from death. Prison doors were opened after Paul & Silas prayed. Elisha prayed for rain to stop & then again for it to rain. The stories could continue, but already we're reminded that prayer not only works, but prayer allows miracles to happen. Why? Because of where prayer goes & what prayer is. Prayer is the valuable link between mankind & God. True prayer is the heart of man communicating with the Almighty Creator, Saviour & wise Councillor, Jehovah God. God freely gives this access to us because of His incredible love for us, & desires a good relationship with every individual that is built on faith & trust.

Happy New Year! Believing 2025 will be your best year yet.


